Instructions:

- 1. **Grab Your Bag:** Inside this bag, you'll find a selection of scrap quilting fabric. Feel free to mix and match colors and patterns to unleash your creativity.
- 2. Size Matters: Aim for a final quilt block size of 12.5" x 12.5". Trim any excess fabric to achieve the desired dimensions.
- 3. Choose Your Block:
 - Simple Grid: Arrange different squares of fabric in a grid pattern.
 - *Nine-Patch:* Divide your block into nine equal squares and mix up the fabrics.
 - Log Cabin: Start with a central square and build outward, adding strips of fabric in a spiral pattern.
 - *Creative Freedom:* These quilt blocks and be anything your mind can create in a 12.5"X12.5" square!
- 4. Sew it Together: Whether you're a seasoned quilter or a beginner, anyone can make a quilt block! Just have fun and enjoy the process!
- 5. **Return Your Masterpiece:** Once your quilt block is complete, drop it off at The Sewing Labs by <u>February 14th</u>, <u>Valentine's Day.</u>

Tips:

- **Experiment:** Don't be afraid to try new things. This project is about expressing your unique style!
- Community Spirit: Consider hosting a virtual or in-person quilting circle to share ideas and progress.
