## Did You Know...?

Worsted is a type of medium weight yarn. It consits of firmly twisted thread spun from combed, stapled wool fibers. Althought this is a common (and popular) material for countless crocheters, we have to wonder; why the odd name?

### Sew What Now?

Does tension make you tense? The easiest way to remember is this: Higher=tighter,

lower=looser. Tension is the balance between needle and bobbin threads. Ideally, they should interloop between the layers of fabric.

If the top is loose, the loops from the needle thread appear on the bottom. If the bobbin is loose (a rarer thing), its loops appear on the top. If the loops on the wrong side are very big, a big adjustment (of something) is needed. If the misplaced loops are small, a small adjustment is needed.


### Corrections
